Nature of Wisdom

- The Lord created wisdom before he created anything else (Prov. 8:22-26; 1Cor. 2:7)
- With wisdom, the Lord founded the earth (Gen. 1:1) (Prov. 3:19; 8:27-31; Ps. 104:24; Jer. 10:12; 51:15)
 - By understanding, He established the heavens (Gen. 1:1) (Prov. 3:19; 8:27; Ps. 136:5; Jer. 10:12; 51:15)
 - By His knowledge, the deep fountains burst forth, and the clouds poured down rain (Gen. 7:11) (Prov. 3:20)
- It calls the simple-minded to come and listen to it, and it will make them wise (Prov. 1:20-21; 8:1-5; 9:3-6)
 - It has prepared a place for everyone to come and feast with it (Prov. 9:1-3)
 - It calls often, but they don't come (Prov. 1:24, 9:4-6)
 - It reaches out, but they pay no attention (Prov. 1:24, 8:5)
 - They ignored its advice and rejected its correction (Prov. 1:25; 12:15)
 - All who hate wisdom, love death (Prov. 8:36)
 - Then when disaster strikes, it is too late, it will not answer their cries (Prov. 1:26-33)
- Its words are plain to those who have understanding; who want to learn (Prov. 8:9)
 - Everything it says is right (Prov. 8:6)
 - It speaks the truth and hates all deception (Prov. 8:7)
 - Its advice is wholesome and good. It is not crooked or twisted (Prov. 8:8, 14)
- Wisdom is vindicated by its deeds (Matt. 11:19)
- All its ways are satisfying (Prov. 3:17)
- True wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, reasonable, full of mercy and good fruits, unwavering, and without hypocrisy (James 3:17)
- With wisdom comes prudence, knowledge, and discretion (Prov. 8:12)
- It loves all who love it (Prov. 4:6; 8:17)
- Wisdom is sweet to your soul like honey to the mouth (Prov. 2:10; 14:33; 24:13-14)
- It hates pride, arrogance, corruption and perverted speech (Prov. 8:13)

- It lives together with good judgment (Prov. 8:12)
 - It knows where to find knowledge and discernment (Prov. 8:12)
 - It walks in righteousness, in paths of justice (Prov. 8:20)
- Listen to what your father teaches you and not neglecting your mothers teaching that you may gain understanding (Prov. 1:8, 4:1-2, 10-11, 20; 5:1-2; 6:20-23)
 - Wisdom is with the aged; with long life is understanding (Job 12:12)
 - However, wisdom doesn't necessarily come with old age (Job 32:7-8)
- Follow in the steps of goodness, stay on the paths of the righteous (Prov. 2:20-21)
- Keep and do God's commandments, for that is your wisdom (Deut. 4:6; Ps. 19:7; 111:10; 119:104, 130)
 - Scriptural Example: David (Ps. 119:98-100)
- Whoever walks with the wise, will become wise (Prov. 13:20)
 - The mouth of the righteous speaks wisdom (Prov. 10:13; Ps. 37:30)
 - The words of the godly lead to life (Prov. 10:11; 13:14)
 - Their words are like sterling silver (Prov. 10:20)
 - Wise words come from those with understanding (Prov. 10:13)

- Listen to the words of the wise (Prov. 5:1-2; 22:17)
- Wisdom comes along with humility (Prov. 11:2)
- If you listen to constructive criticism, you will be at home among the wise (Prov. 15:5, 31)
 - You will grow in understanding (Prov. 15:32)
- To acquire wisdom is to love oneself (Prov. 19:8)

What it is worth?

- Man does not know the value of wisdom (Job 28:13)

- Will make the simple minded clever (Prov. 1:4)
- Will give knowledge to young people (Prov. 1:4)
- Will make the wise, wiser (Prov. 1:5)
- Will give guidance to those who understand (Prov. 1:5)
- Will crown you with grace and clothe you with honor (NLT) (Prov. 1:9)
- The teaching of the proverbs will help you trust in the Lord (Prov. 22:19)
 - They teach the truth (Prov. 22:21)
- It is good to keep them deep within yourself, always ready on your lips (Prov. 22:18)
- In the mouth of a fool, a proverb becomes as limp as a paralyzed leg (Prov. 26:7)
 - It is as dangerous as a thornbush brandished by a drunkard (Prov. 26:9)

 - God also gives us the ability to teach our abilities to others (Ex. 35:34)
- Abortion (the life of the unborn)
 - The Bible Clearly Considers the Unborn a Human Being Equal in Right to Each of Us
 - The Lord cares for the unborn (Ex. 21:22-25)
 - Scriptural Example: David (Ps. 139:13-16)
 - He is our God even from our mother's womb (Ps. 22:9-10)
 - Even before we were in the womb, God knew us (Jer. 1:5)
 - He calls us to do His will from the womb (Is 49:1, 5; Jer 1:5)
 - Scriptural Example: Paul (Gal. 1:13-17)
 - The unborn are aware of their surroundings (Luke 1:41, 44)
 - The child that dies at birth goes to the same place as kings and princes who have already died (Job 3:11-15)
 - The stillborn child is at rest with both the small and the great (Job 3:16-19)
 - The stillborn child has more rest than a man who lived a long life but has never seen goodness (Eccl. 6:3-6)

- Adultery

- You shall not commit adultery (Ex. 20:14; Lev 18:16,20; Deut. 5:18; 22:22; Matt. 19:18)
- Definition
- Whoever looks at another woman in lust commits adultery in his mind (Matt 5:27-28)
- Whoever divorces his wife except for unfaithfulness commits adultery (Matt 5:31-32; 19:9; Luke 16:18)
 - If you divorce someone and marry another, you commit adultery (Mark 10:11-12; Luke 16:18)
 - But after the spouse has died, they are free and can re-marry (Rom.7:3)
- Also, whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery (Matt 5:31; Mark 10:12; Luke 16:18)
- Sleeping with an engaged person is also considered adultery by God (Deut. 22:23-24)
- Consequences
- The Lord is a ready witness against adulterers (Jer. 29:23; Mal. 3:5; Heb. 13:4)
 - Scriptural Example: David (2Sam. 11:2-5; 12:1-12)
- The person who commits adultery is an utter fool (Prov. 6:32)
 - An adulterous woman can satisfy her sexual desires and then say, "What's wrong with that?" (Prov. 30:20)
 - She leaves the companion of her youth (sim. Mal. 2:14-15), and forgets the covenant of her God (Gen. 2:24) (Prov. 2:17)
 - They will not go unpunished (Prov. 6:29)
 - They will destroy their own soul (Prov. 6:32)
 - The adulterer will not inherit the kingdom of God (1Cor. 6:9-10)
 - Their shame will never be erased (Prov. 6:33)
 - The other's spouse will have no mercy on them (Prov. 6:34-35)
 - It may cost them their life (Prov. 6:26; Lev. 20:10; Job 24:15-17)
 - but...
 - The sin of adultery can be forgiven (John 8:1-11)
 - Scriptural Example: Gomer (Hosea 3:1-5)
- Spiritual Adultery
- You commit adultery when you worship anything other than God (Ezek. 23:37)

- Advice

- Good advice
- Where can you get it?
- God will guide you with His counsel (Ps. 32:8; 73:24)
 - He is great in counsel (Jer. 32:19)
 - Jesus is the Wonderful Counselor (Is. 9:6; 28:29)
 - God's testimonies are our counselors (Ps. 119:24)
- The wise and the godly give good advice (Prov. 10:21, 31-32)
 - Though good advice lies deep within a person's heart, the wise will draw it out (Prov. 20:5)
- From pastors or priests (Mal. 2:7)
- Why should you get it?
- Those who take advice are wise (Prov. 13:10)
 - They avoid the snares of death (Prov. 13:14)
- Timely advice (a word fitly spoken-NKJV) is as lovely as golden apples in a silver basket (Prov. 15:23; 25:11)
- Many counselors bring success (Prov. 11:14; 15:22)
- Plans succeed through good counsel (Prov. 20:18)
 - Plans go wrong for lack of advice (Prov. 11:14; 15:22)
- Bad advice
- The advice of the wicked is treacherous (Prov. 12:5; 2Chr. 10:9-10)
 - Scriptural Example: King Ahaziah (2Chr. 22:2-9)
- Do not follow the advice of the wicked (Ps. 1:1)
 - Scriptural Example: Rehoboam (2Chr. 10:1-19)
- Don't waste your breath on fools, for they despise the wisest advice (Prov. 23:9)

- Aging

- The righteous will still yield fruit in old age (Ps. 92:12-14)
- Older men are to be temperate, dignified, sensible, sound in faith, in love, and in perseverance (Titus 2:2)
- Older women are to be reverent in their behavior, not malicious gossips, nor enslaved to much wine, teaching what is good, (Titus 2:3)

- They should encourage the younger women to love their husbands and children, to be sensible, pure, workers at home, kind, being subject to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be dishonored (Titus 2:4-5)
- Wisdom is with the aged; with long life is understanding (Job. 12:12)
- Even in your old age, God will carry and deliver you (Is. 46:4)
- Gray hair is a crown of glory (Prov. 16:31)
 - It is gained by living a godly life (Prov. 16:31)
 - The gray hair of experience is the splendor of the old (Prov. 20:29)
- One who has been blessed by God will not consider the years of his life because God keeps him occupied with the gladness of his heart (Eccl. 5:20)
- Grandchildren are the crowning glory of the aged (Prov. 17:6)
 - Scriptural Example: Jacob (Gen. 48:11-20)
- Good people leave an inheritance to their grandchildren (Prov. 13:22; Ezra 9:12)

- Anger and self-control

- The Lord is slow to anger and rich in unfailing love (Ex. 34:6; Num. 14:18; Neh. 9:17; Ps. 86:15; 103:8; 145:8; Joel 2:13; Jonah 4:2; Nahum 1:3)
- General
- Anger resides in the bosom of fools (Eccl. 7:9)
 - Anger kills the foolish person (Job. 5:2)
- Do not be eager in your heart to be angry (Eccl. 7:9)
 - Cease from anger, and forsake wrath (Ps. 37:8; Eph. 4:31; Col. 3:8)
- Anger is cruel, and wrath is like a flood (Prov. 27:4)
 - Anger does not achieve the righteousness of God (James 1:20)
 - Anger gives the devil an opportunity (Eph. 4:26-27)
- Anger causes quarrels (Prov. 10:12; 29:22; 30:33)
- Keep away from angry, short-tempered people or you will learn to be like them and endanger your soul (Prov. 22:24-25)
- Do not let the sun go down on your anger (Eph. 4:26)
- Be angry, but do not sin (Ps. 4:4; Eph. 4:26)
- People Who Control Their Anger
- Those who control their anger will have great understanding (Prov. 14:29; 17:27)
- People with good sense restrain their anger (Prov. 19:11; 29:8,11; James 1:19)
 - They earn esteem by overlooking wrongs (Prov. 19:11)
 - The wise stay calm when insulted (Prov. 12:16; 2Tim. 2:24)
 - Scriptural Example: Jesus (Matt. 27:11-14)
 - A cool-tempered person tries to stop fights (Prov. 15:18)
 - Composure allays great offenses (Eccl. 10:4)
 - Scriptural Example: Abigail (1Sam. 25:24-33)
 - Let him give his cheek to the smiter (Lam. 3:30; Matt 5:39; Luke 6:29)
 - Scriptural Example: Jesus (Is. 50:6-7)
- It is better to have self control than to conquer a city (Prov. 16:32)
- A relaxed attitude (sound heart) lengthens life (is life to the body) (Prov. 14:30; 15:13)
- People Who Don't Control Their Anger
- A fool is quick-tempered upon being insulted (Prov. 12:16)
 - A fool gives full vent to anger (Prov. 29:11)
 - Scriptural Example: Cain (Gen. 4:1-8)
 - Those who are short-tempered do foolish things (Prov. 14:17,29; Eccl. 7:9)
 - Short-tempered people must pay their own penalty (Gen. 49:5-7). If you rescue them once, you will have to do it again (Prov. 19:19)
- A hothead starts fights (Prov. 15:18; 26:21; 29:22)
- A person without self-control is as defenseless as a city with broken down walls (Prov. 25:28)

- Arguments

- The Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome (1Tim. 3:3; 2Tim.2:24)
- Who Starts Them?
- Any fool can start a quarrel (Prov. 20:3)
 - Foolish and ignorant speculations can start quarrels (2Tim. 2:23)
- Fools get into constant quarrels; they are asking for a beating (Prov. 18:6)

- Anyone who loves to quarrel loves sin (Prov. 17:19)
- They are started by your source of pleasures...you lust and envy, and you cannot have, so you argue and fight (James 4:1-2)
- <u>How Do You Prevent The</u>m?
- Beginning a quarrel is like opening a floodgate (Prov. 17:14)
- Be like the deaf and dumb man who does not hear, and in whose mouth are no arguments (Ps. 38:13-14)
- Drop the matter before a dispute breaks out (Prov. 17:14)
- What Do You Do While Arguing?
- When arguing with fools, use good judgment. Say just enough so they do not become wise in their own estimation, but not so much as to become as foolish as they are (Prov. 26:4-5)
 - **WWJD:** Jesus Answers the Pharisees and Sadducees (Matt. 16:1-4)
- How Do You Stop Them?
- Quarrels disappear when gossip stops, just as fire goes out for lack of fuel (Prov. 26:20)
 - Drive out the scoffer, and contention will go out (Prov. 22:10)
- Consequences Of Arguments
- Arguments separate friends like a gate locked with iron bars (Prov. 18:19)
 - It is harder to make amends with an offended friend than to capture a fortified city (Prov. 18:19)
- Woe to the one who quarrels with his Maker (Is. 45:9)
- Interfering In Another Person's Argument
- Interfering with someone else's argument is as foolish as yanking a dog's ears (Prov. 26:17)

- Astrologers (Psychics, Sorcerers, Diviners)

- Faith in astrologers is useless (Is. 47:9, 12-15)
 - God makes fools out of diviners (Is. 44:24-25)
 - Scriptural Example: Nebuchadnezzar's astrologers (Dan. 2:10-11)
- You shall not practice divination or soothsaying (Lev. 19:26; Deut. 18:10-12,14)
 - You will be punished (Ex. 22:18; Lev. 20:27; 2Kings 23:24; 1Chr. 10:13-14; 2Chr. 33:6; Jer. 27:9-10; Ezek. 13:20-23; Mal. 3:5)
 - Scriptural Example: Israel (2Kings 17:17-18)
- Do not turn to mediums or spiritists (Lev. 19:31; 1Chr. 10:13-14); Jer. 27:9)
 - Scriptural Example: Saul (1Sam. 28:6-20)
 - God will turn His face against you if you do (Lev. 20:6)
 - Scriptural Example: King Manasseh (2Kings 21:6, 11-12; 2Chr. 33:6,11)
 - Why consult a spiritist? Why consult the dead on behalf of the living? Consult God instead (Is. 8:19)

- Baptism

- If you believe that Jesus is the Son of God with all your heart then you may be baptized (Acts 8:36-7)
 - No one can refuse water for these to be baptized (Acts 10:47-48)
- Men baptize with water, but Jesus baptizes with the Holy Spirit (Matt. 3:11; Mark. 1:8; Luke 3:16; John 1:33; Acts 1:5; 11:16)
- Jesus Himself was baptized (Matt. 3:15-16)
- Baptism saves you not the one that washes the dirt off of you, but the one that comes through the appeal to God for a clear conscience through the resurrection of Jesus Christ (1Peter 3:21)

- Bribes

- <u>General</u>
- The Lord will not take a bribe (Deut. 10:17)
- You shall not take a bribe (2Chr. 19:7), for a bribe blinds the clear-sighted and subverts the cause of the just (Ex. 23:8; Deut. 16:19)
- Those who hate bribes will live (Prov. 15:27; Ps. 15:5)
- Those Who Give Bribes
- Bribes seem to work like magic for those who give it (Prov. 17:8; Eccl. 7:7)
 - They (who give bribes) succeed in all they do (Prov. 17:8)
 - A secret bribe pacifies fury (Prov. 21:14)
- Those Who Accept Bribes
- The wicked accept secret bribes to pervert justice (Prov. 17:23; 1Sam. 8:3; Is. 5:23; Amos 5:12)
- They are cursed by God (Deut. 27:25)

- Business

- Develop your business first before building your house (NLT) (Prov. 24:27; sim. 27:23-27)
- The Lord demands fairness in every business deal; He sets the standard (NLT) (Prov. 16:11; Lev. 19:36)
- If the godly compromise (falter before-NKJV) with the wicked, it is like polluting a fountain or muddying a stream (NLT) (Prov. 25:26)
- Do not have a partnership with an unbeliever; the two of you have no part together (2Cor. 6:14-18)

- Cheating

- Ill gotten gain has no lasting value (Prov. 10:2)
- The Lord hates cheating (a false balance-NKJV) (Prov. 11:1)

- Children

- Behold, children are a gift of the Lord (Ps. 127:3)
- Rejoice during your childhood, and follow the impulse of your heart and the desire of your eyes. Yet know that God will bring you to judgment for these things (Eccl. 11:9)

- Children's Responsibilities To Their Parents

- Honor your father and mother (Ex. 20:12; Lev. 19:3; Deut. 5:16; Matt. 15:4; Mark 7:10; Eph. 6:2)
- Listen to what your father teaches you and not neglecting your mothers teaching (Prov. 1:8; 3:1; 4:1-2,10-11,20; 6:20-23; 7:1,24; 23:22,26; Eph. 6:1; Col. 3:20)
 - Obey, guard, and be reminded constantly of their advice (Prov. 7:2-4)
 - Do not turn away from their words (Prov. 4:5; 5:7)
 - You will be sorry if you do (Prov. 5:12-14)
 - Their teaching is a lamp to light the way ahead of you (Prov. 6:23)
- When Will Your Parents Teach You?
- When you sit at home, they will talk to you (Deut. 6:7; 11:19)
- Wherever you walk, their counsel will lead you (Prov. 6:22; Deut. 6:7; 11:19)
- When you sleep, they will protect you (Prov. 6:22; Deut. 6:7; 11:19)
- When you wake up, they will advise you (Prov. 6:22; Deut. 6:7; 11:19)
- Children need to be taught to fear the Lord, and to know His law (Deut. 31:12-13)
- What Happens To Children That Mistreat Their Parents?
- Cursed are those who dishonor their father or mother (Deut. 21:18-21; 27:16; Is. 45:10)
- Their are some people who curse their parents (Prov. 30:11)
- If you withhold help to your parents in time of need you are breaking God's commandment (Mark 7:11-13)

- Even children are known by the way they act, whether their conduct is pure and right (Prov. 20:11)
 - A young person keeps his way pure by keeping it according to God's Word (Ps. 119:9)
- Grandchildren are the crowning glory of the aged (Prov. 17:6)
- The glory of the young is their strength (Prov. 20:29)
- A servant who is pampered from childhood will later become a rebel (will be a son in the end-NKJV) (Prov. 29:21)

- Wise Children

- A wise child brings joy to its parents (Prov. 10:1; 15:20; 23:15,24; 27:11; 29:3)
 - So give your parents joy (Prov. 23:25)
 - A wise child accepts his parents discipline (Prov. 13:1)
 - A wise youth works hard (Prov. 10:5)
 - Young people who obey the law are wise (Prov. 28:7)

- Foolish Children

- A foolish child brings grief to its parents (Prov. 10:1; 15:20; 17:21,25; 19:13)
 - A young mocker refuses to listen to his parents (Prov. 13:1)
 - A lazy youth brings shame (Prov. 10:5)
 - Those who seek out worthless companions bring shame to their parents (Prov. 28:7)

- Children From A Godly Family

- Blessed are the children of the godly (Prov. 20:7; Deut. 28:4; Ps. 37:26; 112:2)

- The children of the godly will be delivered (from punishment) (Prov. 11:21)
- Grandchildren
- Grandchildren are the crowning glory of the aged (Prov. 17:6)
 - Scriptural Example: Jacob (Gen. 48:11-20)
- Good people leave an inheritance to their grandchildren (Prov. 13:22; Ezra 9:12)

- the Church

- I was glad when they said to me, "Let us go to the house of the Lord." (Ps. 122:1)
- The church is the pillar and support of the truth (1Tim. 3:15)
- Pastors
- They should guard knowledge (Mal. 2:7)
- People should go to them for instruction (Mal. 2:7)
- Some preach Christ out of envy and strife, but some preach with good will (Phil. 1:15)
 - The latter do it out of love (Phil. 1:16) but...
 - The former do it out of selfish ambition, rather than pure motives (Phil. 1:17)
- This position should not be filled by a woman (1Tim. 2:12)
- Elders
- An elder must be:
 - Above reproach, the husband of one wife, temperate, prudent, respectable, hospitable, able to teach, able to refute those who contradict, not addicted to wine, not pugnacious combative in nature), gentle, uncontentious, free from the love of money (not fond of sordid gain), a good manager of his household (keep his children under control), not a new Christian, have a good reputation with those outside the church, loving of what is good, just, devout, holding fast the faith, a shepherd, eager (1Tim. 3:1-7; Titus 1:5-9; 1Peter 5:1-4)
- Let the elders who serve well receive double honor (1Tim. 5:17-18)
- Do not receive an accusation against an elder except on the basis of two or three witnesses (1Tim. 5:19)
- Deacons
- Deacons must be:
 - Men of dignity, not double-tongued, not addicted to wine, not fond of sordid gain, holding to the mystery of faith with a clear conscience, beyond reproach, husbands of one wife, good managers of their children and household (1Tim. 3:8-10,12)
- Those who have served well as deacons obtain for themselves a high standing and great confidence in the faith that is in Christ Jesus (1Tim. 3:13)

- Comfort and Courage

- In the world you will have tribulation, but Jesus has overcome the World (John 16:33)
- Just as the sufferings of Christ are ours in abundance, so also our comfort is abundant through Christ (2Cor. 1:5)
 - He comforts us so that we may comfort others (2Cor. 1:4)
- Peace I leave with you; let not your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful (John 14:27)
- Come to Jesus all who are weary and heavy-laden, and He will give you rest (Jer. 31:25; Matt. 11:28-30)
- It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to trust in man (Ps. 118:8-9)
 - God is the God of comfort (2Cor. 1:3)
- Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted (Matt 5:4)
- Be still and know that He is God (Ps. 46:10)

- Write the commandments on your heart, on your hand, and on your home (Deut. 6:6, 8-9; 11:18-20)
- If You Accept God's Law...

- If You Reject God's Law...
- People who despise the word will find themselves in trouble (Prov. 13:13; Num. 15:31; Matt. 7:26-27; Luke 6:49)
 - Whoever annuls one of the least of these commandments and so teaches others, shall be called the least in the Kingdom of Heaven (Matt 5:19; James 2:10)
- Despising them leads to death (Prov. 13:13; 19:16; Lev. 26:14-45)
- To reject the law is to praise the wicked (Prov. 28:4)
- The prayers of a person who ignore the law are despised (Prov. 28:9)
 - The Israelites disobeyed the law by offering defiled sacrifices, and the

Lord did not accept them (Mal. 1:7-14)(See Lev. 22:20,22; Deut. 15:21 for proper sacrifices)

- Complaining

- Do all things without grumbling or disputing (Phil. 2:14; 1Peter 4:9)
 - Why? so that you may prove yourselves to be true children of God (Phil. 2:15)

- Confession of sins (and Repentance)

- If people cover over their sins they will not prosper (Prov. 28:13; Ps. 32:3-5)

but...

- If we confess our sins (Neh. 1:6; 9:2-3; Jer. 3:13), God is faithful and just to forgive us and cleanse us from EVERY wrongdoing (Prov. 28:13; 2Sam. 12:13; Ps. 32:5; 1John 1:9)
- Each time we become guilty of a sin, we need to confess it to God for forgiveness (Lev. 5:5)
 - If we don't confess our sins, the Lord will be preparing to punish us (Ps. 7:12-13)
- Now therefore make confession to the Lord and do His will (Ezra 10:11)
- Repentance
- Repent for the Kingdom of God is at hand (Matt. 4:17; Mark 1:15)
 - Repent for the forgiveness of your sins (Acts 2:38; 3:19; 17:30)
- In repentance and rest you shall be saved (Is. 30:15)
- God takes no pleasure in the death of any, but He wishes that all would turn from their wicked ways and live (Ezek. 18:23,32; 33:11)
 - The kindness of God leads you to repentance (Rom. 2:4)
- Examine and probe your ways, and return to the Lord (Lam. 3:40)
 - Return to the Lord with all your heart (Joel 2:12-13), and He will return to you (Deut. 4:30-31; 30:1-4; 2Chr. 30:9; Jer. 15:19; Zech. 1:3; Mal. 3:7)
- If a wicked man turns from his sins and observes God's statutes, he will surely live and not die (Ezek. 18:21-23,27-28,30-32; 33:14-16,19)
- What happens if you do not confess your sins to God?
- Scriptural Example: David (Ps. 32:3-5)
- unless you repent, you will perish (Luke 13:1-5)

- Conscience

- Do your best to maintain a blameless conscience both before God and before men (Acts 24:16)
- READ: Rom. 14, and 1Cor. 8, for a better understanding of your and other people's consciences
- The Importance Of A Clear Conscience
- Keep a good conscience so that in the thing in which you are slandered, those who revile your behavior in Christ are put to shame (1Peter 3:16)
- Blessed are those who have a tender conscience (NLT) (feareth alway-KJV) (are always reverent-NKJV) (Prov. 28:14)
- To the unbeliever, nothing is pure, but both their mind and their conscience is defiled (Titus 1:15)
- The Results Of A Guilty Conscience
- A murderers tormented conscience will drive him into the grave (Prov. 28:17)
- Cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God (Heb. 9:14)

- Court

- Don't take a fellow Christian to court to be judged by an unbeliever (1Cor. 6:1-7)

- Don't be in a hurry to go to court. You might go down before your neighbors in shameful defeat. (Prov. 25:8)
 - Discuss the matter with them privately. Don't tell anyone else, or others will accuse you of gossip. Then you will never regain your good reputation. (Prov. 25:9-10)
 - If they listen and confess to you, you have gained a brother (Matt. 18:15)
- If a wise person takes a fool to court, there will be ranting and ridicule, but no satisfaction (Prov. 29:9)
- When people go to court, and the judge rightly condemns the guilty, they will be punished (Deut. 25:1-2)

- Criticism

- Accepting Criticism
- Valid criticism is as treasured by the one who heeds it as jewelry made from the finest gold (Prov. 25:12)
- If you listen to constructive criticism, you will be at home among the wise (Prov. 15:5,31)
 - You will grow in understanding (Prov. 15:32)
 - If you accept criticism, you will be honored (Prov. 13:18)

- Rejecting Criticism

- If you reject criticism, you only harm yourself (Prov. 15:32)
 - If you ignore criticism, you will end in poverty and disgrace (Prov. 13:18)
 - You will suddenly become broken beyond despair (Prov. 29:1)

- Death

- The death of a godly person is precious in God's sight (Ps. 116:15)
 - For the Christian, to live is Christ, but to die is gain (Phil. 1:21)
 - Don't be misinformed about Christians who are dead:
 - If we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so will God bring with Him those who have fallen asleep in Jesus (1Thess. 4:13-14; 2Tim. 2:11)
 - In fact, the dead in Christ will rise first at the Lord's coming (1Thess. 4:16-18)
- Death is a result of the first sin and the Curse (Gen. 3:19)
- When we die, we take nothing with us (Job 1:21; Ps. 49:17; 1Tim. 6:7)
- We cannot bring back the dead. We will go to them (2Sam. 12:23)
- Death (the grave) is never satisfied (Prov. 27:20; 30:15-16; Is. 5:14)

- Deceit

- Who Is Doing The Deceiving?
- Deceit fills hearts that plot evil (Prov. 12:20; Jer. 5:26-27)
- Fools deceive themselves (Prov. 14:8)
- A deceitful tongue crushes the spirit (Prov. 15:4)
- The deceitful walk a thorny, treacherous road (Prov. 22:5)

- Wicked people deceive their companions; leading them down a harmful path (Prov. 12:26; 16:29; Gen. 12:10-20)

- Instructions

- Beware of false prophets (Matt 7:15-23; Col. 2:8)
 - You will know them by their fruits (Matt 7:16,20)
 - A bad tree cannot bear good fruit (Matt 7:17-18)
- Whoever values life will stay away from the deceitful (Prov. 22:5)

- Discipline (Punishment)

- Discipline From The Lord
- Happy is the man whom God reproves (Job 5:17; Ps. 94:12)
- Don't ignore the Lord's discipline, or be discouraged when He corrects you (Prov. 3:11; Job 5:17; Heb. 12:5-6)
 - He corrects those He loves (Prov. 3:12; Heb. 12:6; Rev. 3:19)
 - He corrects as a father corrects his children (Prov. 3:12; Deut. 8:5; 2Sam. 7:14; Heb. 12:6)
 - When people do not accept divine guidance, they run wild (Prov. 29:18)
 - Those who abandon the right path will be severely punished (Prov. 15:10)

- The Lord wounds, and also heals (Job 5:18)
- If we do not heed His correction, He will punish us even more (Lev. 26:18, 21, 23-24, 27-28)
- All discipline for the moment seems not to be joyful, but sorrowful; yet to those who have been trained by it, afterwards it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness (Heb.. 12:11)
 - Scriptural Example: the Maccabees (Dan. 11:35)

- Discipline From Parents

- A wise child accepts his parents discipline (Prov. 13:1)
- Only a fool despises a parent's discipline (Prov. 15:5)
- Discipline your children while their is hope. If you don't, you will ruin their lives (Prov. 19:18)
 - A youngster's heart is filled with foolishness, but discipline will drive it away (Prov. 22:15; 29:15)
 - Physical punishment may save them from death (hell) (Prov. 23:13-14)
- If you refuse to discipline your children, it proves you don't love them (Prov. 13:24)
 - If you love them, you will be prompt to discipline them (Prov. 13:24)
- For a servant (child), mere words are not good enough-discipline is needed (Prov. 29:19)
 - Though the words are understood, they are not heeded (Prov. 29:19)
- Discipline In General
- The correction of discipline is the way to life (Prov. 6:23, 10:17)
- Physical punishment cleanses away evil; such discipline purifies the heart (Prov. 20:30)
- If you punish a mocker, the simpleminded will learn a lesson (Prov. 19:25; 21:11)
- Discipline is wasted on fools (Prov. 16:22)
- Why Should You Be Disciplined?
- Whoever learns from correction is wise (Prov. 13:18; 15:5,31-32)
- Discipline for the purpose of godliness is profitable for all things, since it holds the promise for the present life and also for the life to come (1Tim. 4:7-8)
- What Happens When You Don't Respond To Discipline?
- It is stupid to hate correction (Prov. 12:1)
 - Whoever hates correction will die (Prov. 15:10)
 - Those who ignore it will lead others astray (Prov. 10:17)

- Discretion (Taste)

- A beautiful woman without discretion is like a gold ring in a pig's snout (Prov. 11:22)

- Dishonesty

- The Lord hates double standards (dishonest scales) of all kinds (Prov. 11:1; 20:10,23; Lev. 19:35-36; Deut. 25:13-16)
- Those who are crooked will be destroyed (Prov. 11:3; 28:18)
- It is better to be poor than dishonest (Prov. 19:22)

- Divorce

- God HATES divorce (Mal. 2:16)
 - From the beginning it was never meant to be for a couple to divorce (Matt. 19:8)
- It covers one's garment with violence (~ it [covers, overwhelms] one's [wife] with [wrong, unjust]) (Mal. 2:16)
- Whoever divorces his wife except for unfaithfulness commits adultery (Matt 5:31-32; 19:9; Luke 16:18)
 - Also, whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery (Matt 5:31; Luke 16:18)

- Drinking

- What Does the Bible Say About Alcohol?
- Wine is a mocker (Prov. 20:1; Gen. 9:21; Is. 28:7; Lam. 4:21; Hab. 2:5)
 - Wine takes away the understanding (Hos. 4:11)
- Liquor leads to brawls (Prov. 20:1)
- Wine is not the way to riches (Prov. 21:17)
- Wine enslaves the heart (Hos. 4:11)
- Don't let the sparkle and smooth taste of wine deceive you (Prov. 23:31)
 - In the end it bites like a poisonous snake (Prov. 23:32)
 - You will see hallucinations (Prov. 23:33; Is. 28:7)
 - You will say crazy things (Prov. 23:33)
 - You will stagger like a sailor tossed at sea (Prov. 23:34; Ps. 60:3; Is. 28:7)
 - You won't know what hit you, and you will wake up and want another drink (Prov.

23:35; see Is. 5:11)

- Liquor is for the dying, and wine for those in deep depression (Prov. 31:6)
 - Let them drink to forget their poverty and remember their troubles no more (Prov. 31:7)
- Rulers should not crave wine or liquor (Prov. 31:4; Eccl. 10:17)
 - If they drink they may forget their duties and be unable to give justice to the oppressed (Prov. 31:5)
- Is It Okay For Christians to Drink?
- The Lord makes wine which makes the heart glad (Ps. 104:15)
 - Even our Lord Jesus drank a little wine (Matt. 11:19; Luke 7:34)
- Drink a little wine for the sake of your stomach and your frequent sicknesses (1Tim. 5:23)
- Do not be drunk with wine (Is. 28:1), which causes ruin, but be filled with the Holy Spirit (Eph. 5:18)
- Do not carouse with drunkards and gluttons (Prov. 23:20)
- And, if you believe in good conscience that it is okay to have a drink, don't do it in front of a Christian who doesn't feel that way. You may cause him to stumble and sin (Rom. 14:21-22)

- Punishment For Drunkenness

- Whoever is lead astray by them cannot be wise (Prov. 20:1)
- Those who brag about their drinking will be punished (Is. 5:22)
- Those who wake up early and drink all day (Eccl. 10:16-17) will be punished (Is. 5:11)
 - Scriptural Example: Ben-Hadad, King of Aram (1Kings 16:16-21)
 - Woe to those who stay up late in the night and drink to get drunk (Is. 5:11)
- Drunkards are on their way to poverty (Prov. 23:21)
- Those who spend long hours in the bars trying out new drinks have anguish, sorrow, are always fighting, always complaining, unnecessary bruises, and bloodshot eyes (Prov. 23:29-30)

- Education

- To learn, is to love discipline (Prov. 12:1)
- A student is never above his teacher, but will eventually be like him (Matt. 10:24-25; Luke 6:40)
- Be warned: the writing of many books is endless, and excessive devotion to books is wearying to the body (Eccl. 12:12)
- It is senseless to pay tuition to educate a fool who has no heart for wisdom (Prov. 17:16)
- Teaching
- God puts in our hearts the ability and desire to teach (Ex. 35:34)
 - Scriptural Example: Bezalel (Ex. 35:30-35)

- Fairness and justice

- How the Lord Judges

- The Lord judges the peoples (Duet. 1:17; 1Sam. 2:10; 1Chr. 16:33; Ps. 7:8; 135:14; Is. 3:13; 2Tim. 4:1; Heb. 10:30)
 - God will bring every act to judgment, whether good or bad (Eccl. 3:17; 12:14; Ezek. 18:30; 2Cor. 5:10)
 - We shall all give an account of our lives before God (1Peter 4:5)
 - He will render to each man according to his work (Prov. 24:12; Job 34:11; Jer. 17:10; Matt. 16:27; Rom. 2:6; 2Tim. 4:14; Rev. 2:23; 20:12; 22:12)
 - If we judge ourselves rightly, we will not be judged (1Cor. 11:31)
 - He does not show partiality in judgment (Deut. 10:17; Ps. 96:10; 98:9; Is. 11:3; Acts 10:34; Rom. 2:11; Gal. 2:6; Eph. 6:9)
 - He will do no injustice (Zeph. 3:5)

- The Lord despises those who acquit the guilty and condemn the innocent (Prov. 17:15; Ex. 23:7; Lam. 3:35-36)

- Dishonest Money
- Wealth gained from dishonesty quickly disappears (Prov. 10:2; 13:11; 21:6; Job 20:18-19; Jer. 17:11)
 - People who want to get rich quick will only get into trouble (Prov. 20:21; 21:5; 28:20,22; 2Kings 5:20-27)
- A person who gets ahead by showering gifts on the rich will end in poverty (Prov. 22:16)

- Cursed is the cheat who promises a healthy sacrifice, but offers a defective one (Mal. 1:14)
- A person who doesn't give a promised gift is like clouds and wind that don't bring rain (Prov. 25:14)

- Rape is a serious crime in God's eyes; comparable to murder (Deut. 22:25-29; 2Sam. 13:1-29)

- Rebuke

- It is better to listen to the rebuke of a wise man than the song of fools (Eccl. 7:5)

- If you rebuke the wise they will love you all the more (Prov. 9:8; Ps. 141:5)
 - Teach the wise and they will be wiser (Prov. 9:9)
 - Teach the righteous and they will learn more (Prov. 9:9)
 - A single rebuke does more for a person with understanding than a hundred lashes on the back of a fool (Prov. 17:10)
 - If you reprove the wise, they will be all the wiser (Prov. 19:25)
- An open rebuke is better than hidden love (Prov. 27:5; 28:23)
- Rebuking the Wicked
- Don't rebuke the wicked, they will only hate you (Prov. 9:8; 15:12; Amos 5:10; Matt. 7:6)
 - Anyone who rebukes a mocker will get a smart retort (Prov. 9:7)

 - And to pursue righteousness, godliness, faith love, perseverance, and gentleness (1Tim. 6:11; 2Tim. 2:22)
- Practice these things: whatever is true, honorable, right, pure, lovely, of good repute, anything of excellence, and anything worthy of praise (Phil. 4:8-9; 2Peter 1:5-10)
 - It will be righteousness for us if we follow His commandments (Deut. 6:25)
 - For we were created for good works (Eph. 1:4; 2:10)
- Abstain from every form of evil (1Thess. 5:22)
 - Abhor what is evil (Rom. 12:9)
- We are to seek the Lord continually (1Chr. 16:11; 22:19; Ps. 105:4; Is. 55:6; Hos. 10:12; Amos 5:4,6; Zeph. 2:3; Zech. 8:21)
 - Let us press on to know the Lord (Hos. 6:3)
 - If you seek Him, He will let you find Him (2Chr. 15:2; Jer. 29:13)
 - The Lord's hand is favorably disposed on those who seek Him (2Chr. 31:21; Ezra 8:22; Luke 12:31)
 - Though we may not be pure and clean, if we seek God with all our hearts, He will cleanse us (2Chr. 30:18-20)
- We are to walk before God and be blameless (Gen. 17:1; Deut. 18:13; 2Peter 3:14; sim. Gen. 6:9), even perfect (Matt. 5:48)
 - To be blameless means that people can't find any dirt on you (Dan. 6:4; Matt. 26:59-60; Mark 14:55-59)
 - He shows lovingkindness to those who walk before Him with all their heart (2Chr. 6:14)
 - The righteous will walk in the ways of the Lord (Ps. 119:3; Hos. 14:9)
- We are to be holy-for the Lord is holy (Lev. 11:44-45; 19:2; 20:7,26; Num. 15:40; 1Pet. 1:15-16)
- Dedicate yourselves today to the Lord in order that He may bestow a blessing upon you (Ex. 32:29)
- Whoever pursues godliness and unfailing love will find life, godliness, and honor (Prov. 21:21; Amos 5:14; Matt. 5:6)
- Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not lean on your own understanding (Num. 15:39; Deut. 12:8; Judg. 17:6; 21:25). In all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight (Prov. 3:5-6)
- When Jesus comes back, let Him find you practicing these things (Matt. 24:45-51)
 - Be on the alert (Mark 13:33-37; Luke 12:35-40)
- Do not follow the ways of the wicked (Prov. 3:31, 4:14-15; Ex. 23:2; Num. 16:26; Deut. 18:9; Ps. 1:1) **BUT...**
- Do not practice righteousness to be seen (Matt. 6:1)

AND...

- If you know the right thing to do and don't do it, it is a sin (James 4:17)
 - Therefore, don't just do what is right in your own eyes (Deut. 12:8)
- Benefits of Right Living
- God will not reject a man of integrity (Job 8:20)
- Right living is a safeguard against death (Prov. 10:2, 11:4; Gen. 7:1; Ps. 37:18; Dan. 3:15-30)
- The Lord will repay each man for his righteousness and his faithfulness (Prov. 11:18; 1Sam. 26:23; 2Chr. 6:23; Ps. 62:12; Is. 3:10; Hos. 10:12)

- The godliness of good people rescues them (Prov. 11:6; 13:6)
- If you search for good, you will find favor (Prov. 11:27)
 - The Lord approves of those who are good (Prov. 12:2; Gen. 4:7)
- The Lord is more pleased when we do what is right than when we give Him sacrifices (Prov. 21:3; ISam. 15:22; Ps. 40:6-8; 51:16-17; Jer. 7:22-23)
 - He desires compassion and not sacrifice (Hos. 6:6; Matt. 9:13; 12:7)

- Be Prepared
- You will be hated on the account of Christ (1John 3:13), but the one who endures will be saved (Matt. 10:22; 1Peter 2:20)
 - If the world hates you, know that it is just because the world hates Jesus (John 15:18-19)
- Many are the afflictions of the righteous (John 15:20; Acts 14:22), but the Lord will deliver him from all of them (Ps. 34:19; 2Cor. 4:8-12; 2Tim. 3:11-12)
 - To us it has been granted for Christ's sake, not only to believe in Him, but also to suffer for His sake (Phil. 1:29)
 - Tribulation leads to perseverance which leads to proven character which leads to hope which is from God and will not disappoint (Rom. 5:3-5)
 - So gird yourselves with strength (the full armor of God) (Eph. 6:10-17)
 - Greater is He who is in you than he who is in the world (1John 4:4)
- If you suffer for the sake of righteousness, you are blessed. And do not fear their intimidation, and do not be troubled (James 1:2; 1Peter 3:14; 4:14)
 - Blessed are you when they insult you for God's sake (Matt. 5:10-11; Luke 6:22)
 - Rejoice (Acts 5:41; 1Peter 4:13), be glad, for your reward in heaven will be great (Matt. 5:12; Luke 6:23; James 1:1:12)
 - The sufferings of the present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us (Rom. 8:18)

- Salvation

- O Lord, you have pleaded the case for my soul; You have redeemed my life (Lam. 3:58)

 - Salvation belongs to the Lord (Ps. 3:8)

 - The Gospel is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes (Rom. 1:16)

- Who Can Be Saved?

 - Jesus didn't come only for Israel, but His salvation is to reach the end of the earth (Is. 49:6; Joel 2:32; John 3:16-17; 12:47; Rom. 10:12-13)
 - There is no distinction (Rom. 3:22), He is the savior of all men, but especially those who believe (1Tim. 4:10)
- It is not God's desire that any should die, but that all should repent and live (Ezek. 18:23,32; 33:11; 1Tim. 2:4; 2Peter 3:9)
- Jesus stands at the door of your heart and knocks, hoping that you will let Him in (Rev. 3:20)
- Salvation is our Choice
- We have two choices; life and prosperity, or death and adversity (Deut. 30:15; Jer. 21:8)
 - Choose life, in order that you may live (Deut. 30:19-20)
 - The road is narrow, but strive to take it (Luke 13:24)

- The unsaved are satisfied with leaving their children an inheritance, while the saved will be satisfied with God's likeness when they awake (or when Christ appears) (Ps. 17:14-15; 1John 3:2)
- We are without excuse because God's creation proclaims the eternal power and divine nature of God (Ps. 19:1-6; 50:6; 97:6; Rom. 1:18-20)
- What Does it Mean to be Saved? (Rom. 6 (all))
- If we return to the Lord (Hos. 14:1), He will circumcise our hearts (Rom. 2:29; Col. 2:11) in order that we may live (Deut. 30:2,6; Job 22:23)
- He will give us a new heart and give His Spirit that will cause us to walk in His ways (Ezek. 36:26-27; 2Cor. 5:17)
- For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son that whoever believes in Him shall not die but have eternal life (Mark 16:16; John 3:15-16,36; 5:24; 6:40,47; 11:25-26; Acts 16:31)
 - As many as have received Him, to them He gave the right to be called children of God (Deut. 14:1; Rom. 8:16; John 1:12)
 - He is the bread of life (John 6:48), he who comes to Him will never hunger (John 6:35,50-51)
 - Unless you eat the flesh of Christ (the bread of life) and drink His blood (the forgiveness of our sins (Matt. 26:27-28; Mark 14:23-24; Luke 22:20)) there is no life in you (John 6:53-58)
 - If you do this, you will live forever (John 6:54)
 - He is the light of the world, he who follows Him will not walk in darkness but shall have the light of life (John 8:12)
 - He who believes in Him will not be judged (John 3:18; Rom. 8:1)
 - All who come to Him will certainly not be cast out (John 6:37)
 - If you don't believe, you will be condemned (Mark 16:16)
 - You have already been judged for your unbelief (John 3:18)
 - Being justified by God's grace we are made heirs according to the hope of eternal life (Titus 3:7)
- The life of flesh is in the blood; by reason of the life, the blood shed on the alter (the sacrifice) makes atonement for our souls (Lev. 17:11)
 - Without shedding of blood, there is no forgiveness (Heb. 9:22)
 - In Christ, we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our sins, according to the richness of His grace (Rom. 5:9; Eph. 1:7; Rev. 1:5)
- He Himself bore our sins in His body on the cross, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness; for by His wounds we are healed (1Peter 2:24)
- You have been bought with a price (Ps. 31:5; 1Cor. 6:20; 7:23), purchased with the blood of Christ (Acts 20:28; Eph. 1:7; Rev. 5:9)
 - He gave His life a ransom for many (Mark 10:45; 1Tim. 2:6)
 - He who receives Jesus, receives God who sent Him (Matt. 10:40)
 - The Lord redeems the soul of His servants; and none of those who take refuge in Him will be condemned (Ps. 34:22; Titus 2:14)
 - With Him is abundant redemption (Ps. 130:7)
 - Everyone who is redeemed by Him belongs to Him (Is. 43:1)
- Everyone who is recorded in the Book of Life is holy and will live in the New Jerusalem (Is. 4:3; Dan. 12:1; Rev. 21:27)
- Just as God lived among the people in His Sanctuary (Ex. 25:8), so we as Christians are sanctuaries, and the Holy Spirit lives within us (1Cor. 3:16; 6:19; 2Cor. 6:16)
- Even after our skin is destroyed, yet from our flesh we will see God (Job 19:26)
- How Can We Be Saved?
- You cannot buy God's gift of salvation (Acts 8:19-20)
 - And you cannot work your way to salvation (Rom. 3:20; Eph. 2:8-9)
- Truly I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God (John 3:3,5)
 - That which is born of flesh is flesh, that which is born of the Spirit is spirit (John 3:6)
- God's plan of salvation is not far away, it is in our mouths and in our hearts that we may observe it (Deut. 30:11-14) This is righteousness through faith. If we confess with our mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in our hearts that God raised Him from the dead, we shall be saved (Rom. 10:6-10)
 - For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son that whoever believes in Him shall not die but have eternal life (Mark 16:16; John 3:15-16,36; 5:24; 6:40,47)

- For in no other name than Jesus can we be saved (Acts 4:12)
- We are saved by grace through faith, not by our good works (Rom. 3:24; Gal. 2:16; Eph. 2:8-9; 2Tim. 1:9; Titus 3:5)
 - If we could be saved by good deeds, then Christ died for no reason (Gal. 2:21)
- Say to God, "Take away all iniquity, and receive us graciously" (Hos. 14:2)
 - Because Christ died for your sins (1Cor. 15:3)
 - And God will be faithful to forgive you of your sins (Eph. 1:7; 1John 1:9)
- After our sins are forgiven, if we turn from our wicked ways to walk in God's ways, we will live and not die (Ezek. 18:21-23,27-28,30-32; 33:11-12,14-16,19)
 - Because, in repentance you shall be saved (Is. 30:15)
 - Sorrow that is according to the will of God produces repentance without regret that leads to salvation (2Cor. 7:10)
 - If you don't repent, you will perish (Luke 13:3,5)
- There is much joy in heaven when even one sinner repents and is saved (Luke 15:7,10,11-32)
- Assurance of Salvation
- If you believe in Jesus as the Son of God, the witness of your salvation is in you, that you may know you have eternal life (1John 5:10-13)
- You know you are His when you desire to keep and follow His Word (1John 2:5-6)
- Security of Salvation
- NOTHING CAN SEPARATE US FROM THE LOVE OF JESUS! (Rom. 8:35-39)
 - Nothing will ever snatch you out of His hand (John 10:28-29)
- Having believed in Christ, you were sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise, who is the guarantee of our inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession, to the praise of His glory (Eph. 1:13)
- The gifts and calling of God are irrevocable (Rom. 11:29)
- What now?
- If you have been raised up with Christ, keep seeking the things above, where Christ is (Col. 3:1-2)
- As you therefore have received Christ, so walk in Him (Col. 2:6; 1John 2:5-6)
- Now then, work out your salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God who is at work in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure (Phil. 2:12-13)

- Incest

- It is unnatural, degrading, and indecent (Rom. 1:26-27)

- Sex Before Marriage (Fornication)

- Do not awaken love until the time is right (Song 2:7; 3:5; 8:4)
 - (The word "awaken" means literally to become aware of someone's nakedness, or to be aroused, in the Hebrew language)
- We are given two choices: being a wall (chaste) or a door (promiscuous) (Song 8:9)
 - The young woman in Song of Solomon chose chastity, and it greatly pleased Solomon, her lover (Song 8:10)
 - Don't give in to promiscuity (Rom. 13:13)
 - Flee from youthful lusts (Rom. 13:14; 2Tim. 2:22)
- Abstain from fornication (Acts 15:20,29)
 - For God will judge the fornicators (Heb. 13:4)
- If a man lies with a virgin who is not engaged, according to Old Testament law, they had to get married because he violated her. They could not get divorced (Deut. 22:28-29)
- If you can't control yourselves, get married; it's better than living in your sin (1Cor. 7:9)

- Sin

- The Lord sees iniquity without investigating (Job 11:11)
- If you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it (Gen. 4:7; Rom. 6:12; 1Pet. 5:8)
 - Sin will not master over you, because you are living under God's grace (Rom. 6:14)
- Jesus gave Himself for our sins, that He might deliver us out of this present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father (Gal. 1:4)
- Who Sins?
- Who can say, "I have cleansed my heart; I am pure and free from sin"? (Prov. 20:9; Job 14:4; 1John 1:8,10)
- For all have sinned (1Kings 8:46; 2Chr. 6:36; Eccl. 7:2; Rom. 3:9; 5:12) and come short of the glory of God (Rom. 3:23)

- Consequences of Sin

- Lord, if you should mark iniquities, who could stand? (Ps. 130:3)
- You are responsible for your own sin (Deut. 24:16; Ezek. 18 (all))
- Everyone who commits sin is the slave of sin (John 8:34)
- Your sin will find you out (Prov. 10:9; Num. 32:23; 1Tim. 5:25)
- Your sin will cause you physical and mental anguish (Ps. 38:3-8, 18)
- He who sins against God injures himself (Prov. 8:36; Is. 3:9)
- The Lord will punish the sinful (Ex. 32:33-34; Is. 1:28; Hos. 8:13; 9:9)
 - If a person sins defiantly, they are blaspheming against God, and will be punished severely (Num. 15:30-31)
 - If a person is unaware that they are sinning, they are still guilty and will be punished (Lev. 5:17; Num. 15:27-28)
- The wages of sin is death (Ezek. 18:4,20; Rom. 6:23)

- Instructions
- If Jesus never would have come to us, we would have an excuse for our sins, but now there are no excuses (John 15:22)
- Repent for the Kingdom of God is at hand (Matt. 4:17)
 - Return to the Lord with all your heart (Joel 2:12-13), and He will return to you (Deut. 4:30-31; 30:1-4; 2Chr. 30:9; Jer. 15:19; Lam. 3:40; Zech. 1:3; Mal. 3:7)
 - If you turn from your evil ways you will live and not die (Ezek. 18:21-23,27-28,30-32; 33:11-12.14-16.19)
 - Where sin increases, grace increases all the more (Rom. 5:20)

HOWEVER...

- If we go on sinning willfully after receiving the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins (Rom. 6:1-2,15-16; Heb. 10:26)

- Spiritual Gifts

- There are a variety of gifts; but one Spirit (1Cor. 12:4)
- To each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good (1Cor. 12:7)
 - For we are all individual parts of the body of Christ. No part is more important than another part, and each part is crucial to the body (1Cor. 12:12-27)
- Seek gifts that edify the church (1Cor. 14:12)

- Stealing

- You shall not steal (Ex. 20:15; Lev. 19:11,13; Deut. 5:19)
- Do not vainly hope in robbery (Ps. 62:10)
- Don't steal your neighbor's property by moving the boundary markers (Prov. 22:28; Deut. 19:14; 27:17)
 - Nor steal land from defenseless orphans in the same way, for their Redeemer is strong and will bring their charges against you (Prov. 23:10-11)
- Robbing from your parents and then saying, "What's wrong with that?" is as serious as committing murder (NLT) (they are a companion to a destroyer-NKJV) (Prov. 28:24)
- For a piece of bread man will transgress (Prov. 28:21; Ezek. 13:19)
 - Stealing food because you're starving might sound ok, but you will be fined heavily (Prov. 6:30-31)
 - Stolen bread tastes sweet, but it turns to gravel in the mouth (Prov. 20:17)
- If you assist a thief you are only hurting yourself (Prov. 29:24)
 - You will be punished if you report the crime (NLT) (Prov. 29:24)
 - You will be cursed if you don't report the crime (NLT) (Prov. 29:24; Lev. 5:1)

- Stinginess

- Those who are stingy will lose everything (Prov. 11:24)
- Don't eat with people who are stingy. "Eat and drink," they say, but do not mean. They are always thinking about how much it costs. You will have to take back your words of appreciation for their "kindness" (Prov. 23:6-8)

- Strength

- I love Thee, O Lord, my strength (Ps. 18:1)
- General Characteristics of Strength
- Not by might shall a man prevail (1Sam. 2:9)
 - Wisdom is better than strength (Eccl. 9:16)
 - A wise man is strong (Eccl. 7:19); a man of knowledge increases strength (Prov. 24:5)
 - The wise conquer the city of the strong and level their trusted fortress (Prov. 21:22)
 - The horses are prepared for battle, but the victory belongs to the Lord (Prov. 21:31; 1Sam. 17:47; Ps. 33:17; sim. Ps. 44:3)
- Do not spend your strength on women (Prov. 31:3)
- How Can We be Strengthened?
- God gives us strength (1Sam. 30:6; 2Sam. 22:40; 1Chr. 29:12; Ezra 7:28; Ps. 18:32,39; 29:11; 138:3; Is. 41:10; 2Tim. 4:17)
 - Those who wait for the Lord will gain new strength; they will mount up with wings like eagles, they will run and not get tired, they will walk and not become weary (Is. 40:31)
 - The Holy Spirit can give us strength (Judg. 14:5-6; 15:14; 16:28-30)
 - The Lord will strengthen the heart of the afflicted (Ps. 10:17; Is. 40:29)
 - The joy of the Lord is your strength (Neh. 8:10)

- The Lord will be your confidence (Prov. 3:26; Job 4:6)
- And you can do all things through Christ who strengthens you (Phil. 4:13)
- Strength comes with wisdom (Prov. 8:14), but wisdom is better (Eccl. 9:16)
- In quietness and trust is your strength (Is. 30:15)
- If you fail under pressure, your strength is not very great (Prov. 24:10)
 - Remember how Christ suffered for you so you will not become weary (Heb. 12:3)

 - To us it has been granted for Christ's sake, not only to believe in Him, but also to suffer for His sake (Phil. 1:29)
 - Tribulation leads to perseverance which leads to proven character which leads to hope which is from God and will not disappoint (Rom. 5:3-5)
 - So gird yourselves with strength (the full armor of God) (Eph. 6:10-17)
 - Greater is He who is in you than he who is in the world (1John 4:4)
- What Can We Do to Avoid/End Suffering?
- Keep God's commandments (Deut 8:6 in context of vv. 2-5)
- Come to Jesus all who are weary and heavy-laden, and He will give you rest (Jer. 31:25; Matt. 11:28-30)
- Who Can Comfort Us?
- Just as the sufferings of Christ are ours in abundance, so also our comfort is abundant through Christ

(2Cor. 1:5)

- He comforts us so that we may comfort others (2Cor. 1:4)
- He is the refuge for the afflicted (Ps. 14:6; 18:27; 73:26)

- Swearing

- Do not take the Lord's Name in vain (Ex. 20:7; Lev. 18:21; 19:12; 24:10-16; Deut. 5:11)
 - Do not curse God (Ex. 22:28)
- Avoid perverse speech (Prov. 4:24)
- Perverse speech is a sin, whether it was to do good or bad (Lev. 5:4)
- Wisdom hates perverted speech (Prov. 8:13)
- Rewards for Controlling Your Language
- Those who control their tongue will have a long life (Prov. 13:3)

- Talking

- The mouth speaks that which fills the heart (Matt. 12:34; Luke 6:45)
- The tongue can kill or nourish life (Prov. 12:13; 13:3; 18:21; Matt. 12:37; James 3:9-10)
 - If we can control our mouths, we can control the rest of our body (James 3:2-8)
- We can gather our thoughts, but the Lord provides the answer (Prov. 16:1; Ex. 4:12,15; Matt. 10:19-20; Mark 13:11; Luke 12:11-12)
- Let no unwholesome word proceed from your mouth, but only ones that are good for edification according to the need of the moment (Eph. 4:29)

- Talk of the Wise

- From a wise mind comes wise speech (Prov. 10:13; 16:23; Ps.37:30)
 - Wise speech is persuasive (Prov. 16:23; 25:15; Eccl. 10:4)
 - Wise speech is rarer and more valuable than gold and rubies (Prov. 20:15)
 - Wise speech heard in quietness is better than the shouting of a ruler among fools (Eccl. 9:17)
 - Words from a wise mouth are gracious (Eccl. 10:12)
- The godly think before speaking (Prov. 15:28; Ps. 39:1-3; James 1:19)
- A truly wise person uses few words (Prov. 10:19; 17:27; Job 15:1-2; Eccl. 5:2; James 1:19)

- Importance of Wise Speech

- Those who control their tongue are wise (Prov. 10:19; 13:3; James 1:19)
 - If you guard your mouth (Ps. 141:3), you will stay out of trouble (Prov. 21:23)
- A man's stomach shall be satisfied from the fruit of his mouth (NKJV) (Prov. 12:14; 13:2; 18:20)
- Encouraging words cheer a person up (Prov. 12:25)
- Kind words are like honey sweet to the soul and healthy for the body (Prov. 16:24; 18:20)
- Everyone enjoys a fitting reply; it is wonderful to say the right thing at the right time (Prov. 15:23; 25:11)
 - A gentle answer turns away wrath (Prov. 15:1; 2Chr. 10:7; 2Tim. 2:25-26)
 - Gentle words (a wholesome tongue) bring life and health (Prov. 15:4)
 - The right words on a person's lips bring satisfaction (Prov. 18:20)
 - Soft speech can crush strong opposition (Prov. 25:15)

- Talk of the Wicked

- A fool's voice is known by his many words (Eccl. 5:3)
- Even fools are thought to be wise when they keep silent; when they keep their mouths shut, they seem intelligent (Prov. 17:28; Job 13:5)

- Consequences of Wicked Speech

- There is more hope for a fool than for someone who speaks without thinking (Prov. 29:20)

- Talking Too Much

- Fools multiply words (Eccl. 10:14)
- Talking too much fosters sin (Prov. 10:19; 2Tim. 2:16)
- Don't hang around with someone who talks too much (Prov. 20:19)
- For in many words there is emptiness (Eccl. 5:7)

- General Instructions

- Let your speech always be with grace, so that you may know how you should respond to each person (Col. 4:6)
- Keep your tongue from evil, and your lips from deceit (Ps. 34:13)
- You shall not go out as a slanderer (Lev. 19:16)
- There shall be no silly talk, or coarse jesting, which are not fitting, but rather giving of thanks (Eph. 5:4)

- Temptation

Tempting

- Do not tempt or test the Lord (Deut. 6:16; Ps. 78:18-22,41,56; Matt. 4:7; Luke 4:12)
 - Scriptural Example: Israelites in the Wilderness (Ps. 106:13-15)

Being Tempted

- You are tempted when you are carried away and enticed by your own lust (James 1:14)
 - This will then lead to sin and then to death (James 1:15)
- Since Jesus was tempted by Satan, He knows how we feel (Heb. 2:18)
- Pray that you don't fall to temptation (Matt. 26:41; Mark 14:38; Luke 22:40,46)
 - God can rescue you from temptation (2Peter 2:9)
- If sinners entice you (Prov. 1:14), turn your back on them (Prov. 1:10-16; 3:7; Deut. 13; Matt. 4:1-11; Eph. 5:11)
 - Restrain your feet from their path (Prov. 1:15; Ps. 119:101)
- Let no one say, "I am being tempted by God"; He will not tempt anyone (James 1:13)
- God will not allow you to be tempted beyond that which you can handle (1Cor. 10:13)

- Thanksgiving

- Consider what great things He has done for you (1Sam. 12:24)
 - Since we have received the kingdom of God, let us show gratitude (Heb. 12:28)
- In everything give thanks (Ps. 30:4; 50:14,23; 92:1); for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus (1Thess. 5:18)
 - Give thanks when the Lord delivers you from your enemies (Ps. 18:48-49)
- Giving thanks to the Lord pleases Him more than sacrifices (Ps. 69:30-31)

- Thoughts

- Meditate on God's works in your heart upon your bed, and be still (Ps. 4:4; 63:6; 77:6,12; 119:15,48,97,99,148; 145:5)
- Think on these things: whatever is true, honorable, right, pure, lovely, of good repute, anything of excellence, and anything worthy of praise (Phil. 4:8)
- Set your mind on the things above, not on the things that are on the Earth (Col. 3:2)
- The Lord knows the thoughts of man (Ps. 94:11; 139:1; Ezek. 11:5; Matt. 9:4)
 - Nobody knows your thoughts but you (and God) (1Cor. 2:11)
 - No one who looks back after deciding to follow Jesus is worthy of Him (Luke 9:62)

- Treatment of others

- If possible, so far as it depends on you, be at peace with all men (Rom. 12:18)
- Do unto others as you would have done unto you (Matt. 7:12; Luke 6:31)

- Do not call to mind former things, or ponder things in the past (Is. 43:18)

- You shall not wrong one another (Lev. 25:17)
- What Does the Lord Expect from Us?
- What is desired in a man is kindness (NKJV) (Prov. 19:22; Hos. 12:6; Zech. 7:9; Eph. 4:32)
 - Do not let kindness and truth leave you (Prov. 3:3)
- Let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and to good deeds (Heb. 10:24)
- Helping Others in Time of Need
- Encourage others in God (1Sam. 23:16; 2Chr. 35:2; 1Thess. 5:11)
- Help meet the needs of the saints (believers), and be given to hospitality (Rom. 12:13)
- Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy (Prov. 11:17; Matt. 5:7; Luke 6:36)
- Those who save lives are wise (Prov. 11:30)
- Do not withhold good from those who deserve it (Prov. 3:27; Gal. 6:10)
 - If you can help them now; do it. Don't put it off until tomorrow (Prov. 3:28)
 - It is easy to look on the needy with contempt when times are good (Job 12:5; Ps. 123:4)

- Render to all what is due them: tax, to whom tax is due; custom to whom custom; fear to whom fear; honor to whom honor (Rom. 13:7)

- Lying About Other People

- You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor (Ex. 20:16; Deut. 5:20)
 - Who is your neighbor? (Luke 10:29-37)
- Telling lies about others is as harmful as hitting them with an axe, killing them with a sword, or shooting them with a sharp arrow (Prov. 25:18)
 - Telling lies about them and the saying "I was only joking," is as dangerous as a mad man shooting a lethal weapon (Prov. 26:18-19)
- Do not testify spitefully against innocent neighbors (Prov. 24:28)
- Do not make accusations against someone who hasn't wronged you (Prov. 3:30, 6:19)

- Consequences of Mistreating Others

- To God, calling someone a fool is like murder (Matt. 5:21-22)
- You cannot curse whom God did not curse (Num. 23:8; 2Sam. 16:10)
 - Scriptural Example: Balak (Num. 22:1-24:5)
 - Like a fluttering sparrow or a darting swallow, an unfair curse will not land on its intended victim (Prov. 26:2; Deut. 23:5; 1Sam. 18:20-27)
 - If you love to curse, you will be cursed (Ps. 109:17)
- If you set a trap for others, you will get caught in it yourself (Prov. 26:27; 28:10; Esth. 7:9-10; Ps. 7:14-16; 9:15-16; 10:2; 57:6; Eccl. 10:8)
 - Scriptural Example: Haman (Esth. 7:9-10)
- As you have done, it will be done to you (Obad. 15)
 - Scriptural Example: Adoni-bezek (Judg. 1:6-7)
- If you repay evil for good (1Sam. 19:4; Ps. 38:20; 109:4-5), evil will never leave your house (Prov. 17:13; 1Sam. 25; Is. 33:1)
- Judgment will be merciless to one who has shown no mercy (James 2:13)

- Treatment of Fellow Christians

- If your brother sins, reprove him whether he listens or not (Matt. 18:15-17; Luke 17:3-4)
 - If he repents, forgive him (Luke 17:3-4)
 - Forgive others as many times as they wrong you (Matt. 18:21-22; Luke 17:4)
- Whatever you do to help even the least of your brothers you do to Christ (Matt. 25:35-46)
- Bear one another's burdens (Rom12:13), and thus fulfill the law of Christ (Gal. 6:2)

- Treatment of the Elderly

- Honor the elderly (Lev. 19:32)
- Do not sharply rebuke an older man, but rather appeal to him as a father, and an older woman as a mother (1Tim. 5:1-2)

- Treatment of Employees

- Never slander a person to his employer (Prov. 30:10)
 - If you do, the person will curse you, and you will pay for it (Prov. 30:10)

- Treatment of Your Enemies

- Love your enemies (Matt. 5:43-47; Luke 6:27-28,32-35)
 - Bless those who persecute you, and do not curse them (Rom 12:14)
- If your enemies are hungry, give them food to eat. If they are thirsty, give them water to drink (Prov. 25:21; 2Chr. 28:15; Ps. 35:11-14; Rom. 12:20)
 - Scriptural Example: Elisha (2Kings 6:21-23)
 - You will heap burning coals on their heads and the Lord will reward you (Prov. 25:22)
- Do not rejoice when your enemies fall into trouble (Prov. 24:17; Job 31:29-30; Obad 12-13)
 - The Lord will then take their troubles away from them (Prov. 24:18)
 - Those who rejoice at the misfortune of others will be punished (Prov. 17:5; Micah 7:8-9)
- If someone slaps you, turn the other cheek (Lam. 3:30; Matt 5:38-41; Luke 6:29)
 - Repay no one evil for evil (Rom. 12:17)
- Always pray for them no matter what they do to you (Ps. 109:4; Luke 6:28)
 - Scriptural Example: David (Ps. 35:11-16)

- Treatment of Fools

- Guide a fool with a rod to his back (Prov. 26:3)
- Treatment of the Handicapped
- The deaf, dumb, seeing and the blind: The Lord made them all (Ex. 4:11; Ps. 94:9)
- Cursed is he who misleads a blind person (Lev. 19:14; Deut. 27:18)
- Treatment of the Poor
- The poor and the oppressor have this in common: the Lord gives light to the eyes of both (Prov. 22:2; 29:13)
- Blessed are those who help the poor (Prov. 14:21; 22:9; Ps. 41:1-3; Is. 58:10-11)
 - The godly know the rights of the poor (Prov. 29:7; Ps. 72:12-14)
 - The wicked don't care to know (understand such concern-NASB) (Prov. 29:7)
 - Those who help the poor (Deut. 15:7), honor the Lord (Prov. 14:31; Is. 58:7-8)
 - Speak up for the speechless, poor, and helpless, and see that they get justice (Prov. 31:8-9)
 - This is what it means to know God (Jer. 22:16)
 - Those who help the poor will lack nothing (Prov. 28:27)
 - If you help the poor, you are lending to the Lord-and He will repay you (Prov. 19:17; Luke 14:12-14)
- Those who oppress the poor insult their Maker (Prov. 14:31; 17:5)
 - A poor person who oppresses the poor is like a pounding rain that destroys the crops (Prov. 28:3; Matt. 18:28-30)
 - A person who gets ahead by oppressing the poor will end in poverty (Prov. 22:16; Job 20:18-19)
 - He will injure anyone who injures them (Prov. 22:23)

- Treatment of the Poor in Spirit

- Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven (Matt. 5:3)
- Singing cheerful songs to a person whose heart is heavy is as bad as stealing someone's jacket in cold weather or rubbing salt in a wound (Prov. 25:20)
 - But rather, weep with those who weep (Rom. 12:15)
- Do not afflict the widow's and orphans (Ex. 22:22; Ps. 82:3; Zech. 7:10)
 - Defend the orphan and the widow (Is. 1:17)
 - Honor the widow (1Tim. 5:3)
 - The Lord protects the property of widows (Prov. 15:25)
- Encourage the fainthearted (1Thess. 5:14)
- Those who are strong should bear the weaknesses of those without strength (Rom. 15:1)
- Always keep a little extra in case misfortune happens upon someone else (Eccl. 11:2)

- Treatment of Strangers

- Do not oppress any foreigners in your land (Ex. 22:21; 23:9; Lev. 19:33-34; Deut. 10:18-19; Zech. 7:10)
- Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by this some have entertained angels without knowing it (Heb. 13:2)

- **General Instructions**

- While we have the opportunity, let us do good to all men, and to especially to those who are of the household of faith (Gal. 6:10)
- If you learn that you have done someone wrong, drop everything and make it right (Matt. 5:23-26)
- Do not judge (Rom. 14:4,13), lest you be judged yourself (Matt. 7:1-5; Luke 6:37; Rom. 2:1-4; James 2:1-9)

 - If you shout a pleasant greeting to your neighbor too early in the morning, it will be counted as

a curse (Prov. 27:14)

- Trust

- Blessed is the man who makes the Lord his trust (Ps. 40:4)
- Trusting in the Lord
- Trust in the Lord forever, for in God we have an everlasting rock (Is. 26:4)
- Trust in the Lord with all your heart (Ps. 37:3,5; 62:8), and lean not on your own understanding (Prov. 28:26) (Prov. 3:5)
- Those who trust in the Lord will be happy (Prov. 16:20; Ps. 2:12; 9:10; 32:10; 33:21; 34:8; 84:12; Jer. 17:7)
 - Trusting the Lord leads to prosperity (Prov. 28:25; 1Chr. 5:20-22)
 - Scriptural Example: King Hezekiah (2Kings 18:5-7)
 - Put your trust in the Lord and you will be established (2Chr. 20:20; Ps. 125:1; Jer. 39:18)
 - Trust in the Lord for protection from harm (Dan. 6:23)
- Cursed is the man who trusts in mankind and makes flesh his strength (Jer. 17:5; 1Cor. 1:5)
 - In mortal man there is no salvation (Ps. 146:3-4)

- A Trustworthy Person

- Scriptural Example: Temple Workers (2Kings 12:15; 22:4-7)
- The trustworthy will get a rich reward (Prov. 28:20)
- Those who are trustworthy can keep a confidence (Prov. 11:13)
- The Lord delights in those who do keep their word (Prov. 12:22)
- A reliable messenger brings healing (Prov. 13:17; 25:13)

- An Untrustworthy Person

- The Lord hates those who do not keep their word (Prov. 12:22)
 - A person who does not give a promised gift is like clouds and wind that do not bring rain (Prov. 25:14)
- An unreliable messenger stumbles into trouble (Prov. 13:17)
- Putting confidence in an unreliable person is like chewing with a toothache or walking on a broken foot (Prov. 25:19; Job 15:31)
 - It is like cutting off one's feet or drinking poison (Prov. 26:6)
- Backsliders will get what they deserve (Prov. 14:14)

- Truth

 - If you abide in Him, you are truly His disciples; you shall know the truth and the truth shall set you free (John 8:31-32)
 - The truth of the Lord is everlasting (Ps. 117:2)
- He who practices the truth comes to the light, that his deeds may be manifested as having been wrought in God (John 3:21)
- Tell the truth to each other (Zech. 8:16; Eph. 4:25)
- Truth stands the test of time (Prov. 12:19)
 - For we can do nothing against the truth; only for the truth (2Cor. 13:8)
- The Lord delights in those who deal truthfully (Prov. 12:22)
- A wise person is hungry for truth (Prov. 15:14)
 - Get truth and don't ever sell it (Prov. 23:23)
- An honest witness tells the truth (Prov. 12:17; 14:5)
 - An attentive witness will be allowed to speak (testify) (Prov. 21:28)
 - A truthful witness saves lives (Prov. 14:25)

- Understanding

- The breath of the almighty gives us understanding (Job 32:8; 1John 5:20)
 - The Lord's understanding is infinite (Ps. 147:5)
- We can gather our thoughts, but the Lord gives us the right answer (Prov. 16:1)
 - Do not depend on your own understanding (Prov. 3:5; Hos. 10:13)
- The wise are known by their understanding (Prov. 10:23 (NKJV); 16:21)
- People who cherish understanding will prosper (Prov. 19:8)
- A person with understanding is even-tempered (Prov. 17:27)

- Understanding is a life-giving fountain to those who posses it (Prov. 16:22)
- Wisdom is in the sights of those who have understanding (Prov. 17:24)
- The person who strays from understanding will end up in the company of the dead (Prov. 21:16; Ezek. 18:24; Hos. 4:14)

- Wants

- Just as Death and Destruction are never satisfied (Hab. 2:5), so human desire is never satisfied (Prov. 27:20; Eccl. 1:8)
 - People aren't satisfied with money (Prov. 27:20; Eccl. 4:8; 5:10)
- Delight yourself in the Lord, and He will give you the desires of your heart (Ps. 37:4)
- The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want (Ps. 23:1; 34:9-10)
 - If you have food and covering, be content with that (1Tim. 6:8)
 - Scriptural Example: Paul (Phil. 4:11-13)

- Wicked people

- God made men upright, but they have sought out many devices (Eccl. 7:29)
- The Lord and wicked people:
 - They are an abomination to the Lord (Prov. 3:32; 11:20; 15:9; Ps. 5:4,6)
 - The Lord mocks at mockers (Prov. 3:34; Ex. 10:2; Ps. 2:4; 37:13; 59:8; James 4:6)
 - The curse of the Lord is on the house of the wicked (Prov. 3:33; Lev. 26:14-16; Deut. 11:28; Zech. 5:3-4; Mal. 2:2)
 - The Lord lets the wicked fall into trouble (Prov. 1:31; 11:8)
 - He lets the wicked continue their shameful acts (Ps. 50:21; 81:11-12; Eccl. 8:11; Rom. 1:24-25)
 - You can be sure that they will be punished (Prov. 11:21, 31; 17:11; 19:29; Lev. 26:15-17; Ps. 11:6; Is. 3:11)
 - Those who plant seeds of wickedness will harvest disaster (Hos. 8:7; 10:13), and their reign of terror will end (Prov. 22:8; Job 4:8)
 - They will eat of the fruit of their way (Prov. 1:31; Jer. 6:19)
 - The Lord refuses to satisfy the needs of the wicked (Prov. 10:3)
 - He is far from the wicked (Prov. 15:29; Ps. 34:16)
 - The belly of the wicked goes hungry (Prov. 13:25)
 - They will have their fill of trouble (Prov. 12:21)
 - They will be punished with a rod (Prov. 10:13)
 - They will suddenly be broken beyond all hope of healing (Prov. 6:15; 10:25; Job 21:13; Ps. 58:9; 73:19)
 - The wicked come to shame and disgrace (Prov. 13:5; 18:3)
 - He who perverts his ways will be found out (Prov. 10:9; 1Tim. 5:25)
 - They will be removed from the land (earth or country) (Prov. 2:22; 10:30; Deut. 28:63; 1Sam. 12:25; Ps. 37:22,28; 52:5; Is. 13:9)
 - They will be condemned at the time of judgment (Ps. 1:5)
 - Sometimes the wicked are punished to save the godly (Prov. 11:8; 21:18)
 - The Lord created the wicked for punishment (Prov. 16:4; Job 21:30)
 - Scriptural Example: Ben-hadad (1Kings 20:42)
 - They only flourish so that they may be destroyed forevermore (Ps. 92:7)
 - The Lord destroys the wicked (Prov. 10:29, 12:2; 13:6; Gen. 19:1-25; Ex. 15:7; Judg. 19:25-20:35; Ps. 9:5; Mal. 4:1,3)
 - He knows what goes on in their lives, and He will destroy them (Prov. 21:12)
 - The sinner's light will be snuffed out (Prov. 13:9; 20:20; 24:20; Job 18:5)
 - Because they fail to do what is just, their violence boomerangs and destroys them (Prov. 21:7; Ps. 37:12-15)
 - Their years will be cut short (Prov. 1:12, 19, 31-32; 2:22; 10:27; 11:19; 1Kings 1:50-52; Ps. 55:23; Eccl. 7:17)
 - Their days are cut short because they do not fear God (Eccl. 8:13)
 - The house of the wicked will perish (Prov. 14:11; Ps. 37:20)

 - Deceit fills hearts that plot evil (Prov. 12:20)
 - They do deceptive work (NKJV) (Prov. 11:18)
- They stir up trouble constantly (sows discord-NKJV) (Prov. 6:14,19)
- They are quick-tempered (Prov. 12:16)
- Violent people deceive their companions; leading them down a harmful path (Prov. 12:26; 16:29; 24:22)
- They will not rest until they have done an evil deed (Prov. 4:16; Ps. 36:4)
 - Woe to those who work out evil on their beds, and then do it in the morning (Micah 2:1)

 - Evil people seek rebellion (Prov. 17:11)
 - They will not turn from evil (Prov. 13:19)
- They cover up their harmful intentions (violence covers their mouth-NKJV) (Prov. 10:6,11; Ps. 62:4)
 - Like an earthen vessel overlaid with silver dross, are burning (fervent-NKJV) lips and a wicked heart (NASB) (Prov. 26:23)
 - * Dross is an impurity in a metal that is removed by melting
- The wicked put up a bold front (Prov. 21:29)
- The kindness of the wicked is cruel (Prov. 12:10)
- The neighbor of the wicked gets no mercy from them (Prov. 21:10)
- An evil man is held captive by his own sins (Prov. 5:22; 29:6)
 - Their own sin speaks to their heart and flatters them in their own eyes (Ps. 36:1-2)
 - They feed on trash (Prov. 15:14)
 - They shall eat the fruit of their own way (Prov. 1:31-32; 11:5; 14:32; 22:8; Job 4:8; 18:7; Ps. 34:21; 94:23; Is. 3:11; Jer. 6:19)
 - They squander their money on sin (Prov. 10:16)
 - Their ambition traps them (Prov. 11:6; Ps. 9:16)
- The fears of the wicked will all come true (upon him) (Prov. 10:24; Job 15:21)

- People's views on the wicked

- When the wicked take charge, people go into hiding (Prov. 28:12,28)
 - When the wicked are in power, the people groan (Prov. 29:2)

 - But the godly will live to see the tyrant's downfall (Prov. 29:16)
- Mockers can get a whole town agitated (Prov. 11:11; 29:8)
- The whole city will shout for joy when the wicked die (Prov. 11:10)
- A warped mind is despised by everyone (Prov. 12:8)
- Schemers are hated (Prov. 14:17; 24:9; Ps. 64:7-8)
- A person who plans evil will get a reputation as a troublemaker (Prov. 24:8)

- Witnessing

- He who turns a sinner from the error of his way will save his soul from death (James 5:20)
- The Best Witness
- Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in heaven (Matt. 5:16)
- Verbal Witness
- Jesus sends us out as sheep among wolves to witness to others (Matt. 10:16-20; Luke 10:3)
- Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation (Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-16; Luke 9:60)
 - Repentance for forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in Jesus' name to all the nations (Luke 24:47)

- A wife of noble character (Prov. 31:10-31)
 - She is worth more than precious rubies (Prov. 31:10)

 - She will not hinder him, but help him (Prov. 31:12)

- The diligent make use of everything they find (have? or gain?) (the substance of a diligent man is precious-KJV) (Prov. 12:27)
